INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This is an "Operation Iraqi Freedom" investigation. The delay
in dispatching this investigation this report was due to the
lack of secure communication capabilities for CID at Camp
Bucca, Um Qasr Iraq.

This investigation was initiated when MAJ [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Deputy Command Judge Advocate, 800th Military Police
Brigade, Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq notified this office of
the shooting of an EPW by sentry.

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Investigation established probable cause to believe Mr YASIREE committed the offenses of Attempted Murder, Rioting and Aggravated Assault when he incited the crowd to riot then swung and missed hitting SSG [REDACTED] and the feed team with a four foot tent stake and was the victim of Justifiable homicide. *b7C b6A*

b7C b6A Further investigation revealed SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] both sentries on the outside perimeter of compound #1 assigned to 314th Military Police Company, Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq did not committed any offense as they were ordered to fire on Mr YASIREE and were within the Rules Of Engagement. Mr YASIREE died as a result of being shot by SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED]. *b7C b6A*

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AGENT'S INVESTIGATION REPORT

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: About 0800 Zulu, 18 Apr 03, MAJ [redacted] Deputy Command Judge Advocate, 800th Military Police (MP) Brigade, Camp Bucca, Iraq notified this office of a shooting of an Enemy Prisoner of War (EPW) by a Sentry. *b7c/b6-6*

b7c/b6-1
About 0900, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] interviewed SFC [redacted] Feed Team Noncommissioned Officer in Charge, 314th MP Company (Co), Camp Bucca, Iraq, who provided a Sworn Statement wherein he stated about 0620, 18 Apr 03, SSG [redacted], 314th MP Co, witnessed two EPWs engage in a verbal altercation in Compound #1 that turned physical when one assaulted the other with a metal cup. When the MP Feed Team separated the combatants, they conferred and decided to exit the compound. However, about 75-100 EPWs surrounded the MPs. The Feed Team ordered the EPWs to sit. The EPW (later identified as Mr. Ahmed Haddi YASIREE, Internment Serial Number 017251, 1 Jan 78, Samawa, Iraq) that assaulted the other EPW, ran into his tent and returned with a metal pole. This Mr. YASIREE assaulted SSG [redacted] with the pole, but did not strike him. The attack forced the MPs back into the compound's concertina wire fence. SFC [redacted] heard a warning shot fired by an MP (later identified as SPC [redacted], 314th MP Co) on the outside of the compound. Another MP Guard (later identified as SPC [redacted], 314th MP Co) fired a second shot as the EPWs continued their advance. SPC NG then fired the third shot that struck Mr. YASIREE as he swung the pole (See Sworn Statement). *b7c/b6-4*

Agent's Comment: SFC [redacted] picked up the broken metal tent pole from the Death Scene. SFC [redacted] provided an Interview Sketch detailing the layout of Compound #1 and the positions and movement of the Feed Team during the incident (See Interview Sketch).

About 0955, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] coordinated with CPT [redacted] Battalion (Bn) Surgeon, 320th MP Bn, Camp Bucca, Iraq, who pronounced Mr. YASIREE dead at 0630 18 Apr 03. The cause of death was a GSW to the abdomen. CPT [redacted] opined the superficial nicks and cuts on the decedent's legs were normal for the EPWs in Camp Bucca. Mr. YASIREE was alive when he arrived at the Bn Aid Station, but expired soon thereafter despite lifesaving measures. *b7c/b6-4*

About 0110, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] examined the body of the decedent and exposed digital photographs of the gunshot wound (GSW). Mr. YASIREE suffered a perforating GSW to the lower right quadrant of the back that

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exited through the approximate center of his abdomen. A circumferential entrance wound was observed on Mr. YASIREE's back. It was approximately 1/4" in diameter. There did not appear to be any stippling or powder tattooing around the entrance wound. It appeared to be a distant range gunshot. The exit wound might have severed Mr. YASIREE's aorta. It was approximately 1 1/4" long by 1" wide. No defense wounds were apparent on the decedent's arms or legs. A corresponding entrance wound was not apparent on Mr. YASIREE's clothing. A corresponding exit wound was observed on the decedent's tee shirt.

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About 1019, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] coordinated with CPT (Spanish Army) [redacted] Emergency Medical Unit, Camp Bucca, Iraq through a U.S. Soldier Bn Aid Station native Spanish Speaker (NFI). CPT [redacted] provided lifesaving measures to Mr. YASIREE. CPT [redacted] stated Mr. YASIREE was alive and breathing when he was transported to the clinic. Mr. YASIREE was in shock. He stopped breathing twice. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation was conducted and Mr. YASIREE was intubated with a nasogastric tube, prior to finally expiring within approximately fifteen minutes after arrival. CPT [redacted] did not observe any other injuries beside the GSW.

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CPT [redacted] treated the other EPW (later identified as Mr. [redacted] Internment Serial Number 015769, date of birth 16 Jul 77, place of birth Simaua, Iraq) shot during the incident. Mr. [redacted] suffered a perforating GSW to his right forearm. The entrance wound was to the back of Mr. [redacted] forearm; the exit wound was in the front of his forearm. CPT [redacted] gave the Mr. [redacted] an intravenous injection and a pain killer, sewed the wound, applied an antibiotic, and bandaged the wound.

About 1031, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] interviewed Mr. [redacted] with the assistance of SPC [redacted], 314th MP Co, Armorer, native Arabic speaker from Beirut, Lebanon. Mr. [redacted] was advised of the identities of the interviewers and the purpose of this investigation. He was informed he did not have to answer any questions. He was provided a cigarette and a shaded area for the interview. Mr. [redacted] stated he ran away from his National service commitment. He spent the last nine years in Jordan. On 13 Mar 03, he returned to Iraq because he was worried about his family, but felt comfortable because of the presence of coalition forces.

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Mr. [redacted] stated he was sitting in the chow formation when a soldier took one of the EPWs (whom Mr. [redacted] identified as Mr. YASIREE's brother NFI, but he did not know Mr. YASIREE's or his brother's name) out of the formation and tripped and threw him to the ground. This EPW was talking to another of his friends (NFI). They were not fighting. Mr. [redacted] stated EPWs caught talking were removed from the chow formation. The decedent and his friends grabbed the decedent's brother and placed him in the center of their group. Two or three EPWs cursed the soldier.

The soldiers conferred between each other when the decedent decided he did not want to eat. The decedent attempted to return to his tent, but the soldiers would not let him. Mr. [redacted] stated chaos ensued. The soldiers started screaming, but he did not understand what they said. Mr. [redacted] stated he attempted to calm the situation down before attempting to return to the tent.

Mr. [redacted] did not know if the decedent was the EPW who grabbed the pole from the tent. The shooter was outside of the compound. One of the EPWs (Mr. [redacted] did not recall whom) grabbed a metal pole, but did not hit anybody with it. Nevertheless, the decedent was shot. Mr. [redacted] stated he was walking rapidly toward the tent when he was shot. He initially stated he was shot with the first shot, but later identified it as the second one. He stated the first shot was a warning shot into the air. He did not see the decedent get shot.

Mr. [redacted] stated the EPW who recovered the pole from the tent gave it to the decedent. The decedent stated, "If anybody grabs me, I'll hit him." This applied to the soldiers and the EPWs. The decedent was shot as he held the pole in the air approximately seven feet from the soldiers. Mr. [redacted] stated the soldier adjacent to the decedent did not have his MP club out.

Agent's Comment: Mr. [redacted] provided an Interview Sketch detailing the compound and the positions of the MPs and EPWs during the incident. Mr. [redacted] drew the sketch. SPC [redacted] labeled the sketch based on Mr. [redacted]'s descriptions (See Interview Sketch).

About 1149, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted], this office, advised SPC [redacted] of his legal rights, which he waived in the presence of SA [redacted] (See Rights Waiver Certificate).

AGENT'S INVESTIGATION REPORT

SPC [redacted] provided an Interview Sketch detailing the layout of the compound and the positions of the MPs and EPWs during the incident (See Interview Sketch).

b7C/b6A
SPC [redacted] provided a Sworn Statement, wherein he stated he fired a single warning shot from his assigned 9mm Beretta pistol, in defense of the Feed Team. SPC [redacted] stated he did not have a clear shot at the EPWs assaulting the Feed Team, so he fired into the trench surrounding the compound (in between the two sections of double-stranded concertina wire) attempting to disperse the crowd. The shot did not have any affect. He then observed SPC [redacted] fire at Mr. YASIREE as he swung the pole at SSG [redacted]. SPC [redacted] fired a second time when the crowd still had not dispersed (See Sworn Statement).

About 1315, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] observed SPC [redacted] conduct a technical inspection of SPC NG's and SPC [redacted] weapons. SPC [redacted] determined SPC [redacted] assigned M16A2 stock #15, serial #7200975 was fully functional. The magazine contained twenty-eight rounds of 5.56mm ball ammunition. SPC [redacted] assigned M9 pistol stock #103, serial #1275092 was also fully functional. The magazine contained fifteen rounds of 9mm ball ammunition.

SPC [redacted] assigned M9 pistol stock #15, serial #1271038 was fully functional, even though the magazine spring jammed because the magazine was dirty. The magazine contained fourteen rounds of 9mm ball ammunition. SPC [redacted] checked the master authorization list and determined the M16A2 SPC [redacted] carried was assigned to a different soldier. SPC [redacted] was assigned an M249 squad automatic weapon. The M16A2 carried by SPC [redacted] was stock #98, serial #7201010. It was fully functional and the magazine contained thirty rounds of 5.56mm ball ammunition.

DEATH SCENE EXAMINATION: About 1400, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] conducted a Death Scene Examination of EPW Compound #1.

Characteristics of Scene: The death scene was contained within EPW Compound #1, which was at the southwest corner of the EPW compound. EPW Compound #1 was primarily used as an internment facility for Iraqi EPWs. The compound was approximately 100 yards long by 50' wide. The base of the compound was fine, soft-packed, desert sand. The compound contained over 700 EPWs/DCIs, housed in two large tents (toward the south of Compound #1).

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and one smaller tent (in the southeast corner of Compound #1). A 7' deep dry mote surrounded the compound.

Condition of Scene: The two large tents were approximately 100' long by 30' wide. The smaller tent was approximately 20' long by 10' wide. A slit trench latrine facility was in the northwest corner of Compound #1. The water point was in the northeast corner. The mote was bordered by a double-strand of concertina wire towards the interior of the compound and a second double-stranded concertina wire on the other side of the mote. One light stand was positioned at each of the four corners of the exterior of the compound. The lights were not turned on when this Death Scene Examination was conducted.

The incident occurred in the open area north of the southwestern most large tent. SPC NG was approximately 25' from his targets. SPC [redacted] was approximately 33' from the targets. Blood, bullet fragments, expended shell casings, and gunshot impact craters were not discovered during the conduct of the Death Scene Examination. The desert sand had a tendency to cover evidence in a short period of time. A metal detector and luminol were not available for the examination (See AIR of SA [redacted]).

Environmental Conditions: The temperature was approximately 98 degrees Fahrenheit.

Factors Pertinent to Entry/Exit: Entry to Compound #1 could be gained through a metal gate in the center of the north end of Compound #1. The gate could only be secured with a thin metal wire to prevent the gate from swinging. There was no locking device on the gate. In addition, Compound #1 could be breached with an object and/or EPW being thrown on the concertina wire so as to allow passage over the wire.

Scene Documentation: SA [redacted] exposed photographs of the death scene utilizing a digital camera with built-in flash and memory card. The digital photographs were downloaded onto photographic compact disk 030035.259. SA [redacted] prepared a death scene sketch to document the overall layout of Compound #1 (See Photographs on Compact Disk and Death Scene Sketch).

Search Beyond the Immediate Scene: SA [redacted] ^{b7C b6 b1} searched the exterior of Compound #1 for blood, bullet fragments, expended shell casings, and gunshot impact craters; however, none were discovered.

About 0745, 20 Apr 03, SA [redacted] ^{b7C b6 b1} and SA [redacted] ^{b7C b6 b1} coordinated with CPT [redacted] Commander, 314th MP Co, who provided a Memorandum for Record detailing the weapons qualifications of SPC [redacted] and SPC [redacted]. Both ^{b7C b6 b1} qualified with their assigned M16A2 rifles and M9 pistols during mobilization training at Fort Bills, TX prior to deployment. The Memorandum was provided in lieu of the soldiers' Training Records (See Memorandum).

ON 18 APR 03 I SFC [REDACTED] 314TH MP CO, WAS CONDUCTING MY DUTIES AS THE FEED TEAM'S NCOIC. AT APPROX 0920 HRS SSG [REDACTED] 314TH MP CO. WAS FEEDING COMPOUND #1. I PROCEEDED TO COMPOUND #1 TO CHECK WITH SSG [REDACTED] OF ANY FOOD SHORTAGES. WHEN I MADE CONTACT WITH SSG [REDACTED], HE ADVISED ME THAT TWO INDIVIDUALS SITTING IN LINE BECAME INVOLVED IN A VERBAL ALTERCATION THAT ESCALATED WITH A PRISONER ASSAULTING ANOTHER PRISONER WITH HIS METAL CUP. SSG [REDACTED] AND HIS TEAM OBSERVED THE FIGHT AND WERE ABLE TO SEPARATE THE PRISONER THAT WAS ASSAULTED. HOWEVER, WHEN THEY ATTEMPTED TO REMOVE THE PRISONER WHO ASSAULTED THE PRISONER, SSG [REDACTED] AND SEVERAL OTHER AMERICAN SOLDIERS WERE MET WITH RESISTANCE. THE PRISONER THAT RESISTED THE OTHER STOOD UP AND WAS YELLING AND USING HAND GESTURES TO OTHER PRISONERS. THE AMERICAN SOLDIERS, APPROX 5, CAME TOGETHER AT THE FEED TENT AND TALKED ABOUT GETTING OUT OF THE COMPOUND. I JOINED THEM AND ORDERED THEM TO MAKE THEIR WAY TO THE ENTRANCE AND GET OUT. HOWEVER, APPROX 75 TO 100 PRISONER SURROUNDED US AS THEY HAD CUPS FULL OF SAND AND STARTED MAKING HAND GESTURES TO OTHERS TO JOIN THEM. THE FEED TEAM MEMBERS, INCLUDING MYSELF GAVE NUMEROUS ORDERS TO GET

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DOWN, IN ARABIC AND IN ENGLISH. THE INDIVIDUAL THAT ASSAULTED THE PRISONER RAN INTO THE FAR RIGHT TENT AND ~~WALKED~~ ^{WENT} OUT WITH A METAL POLE, APPROX 1 INCH IN DIAMETER AND APPROX A FEET TALL. ON ONE END, THE POLE HAD A SHARP EDGE THAT ENFERED APPROX 1 IN COMPLETELY AROUND THE POLL. THE PRISONER THAT WALKED OUT WITH THE POLL STARTED SWINGING WILDLY AT US AS WE BACKED UP INTO THE BARB WIRE WITH APPROX. 75 TO 100 INDIVIDUALS AROUND US. AT THAT MOMENT I HEARD A SHOT FIRED THAT HAD NO AFFECT ON THE CROWD. THE PRISONERS BEGAN THROWING SAND AND ~~THAT~~ ^{THE} INDIVIDUAL WITH THE POLE CONTINUED SWINGING, CONCENTRATING ON SSB [REDACTED]. 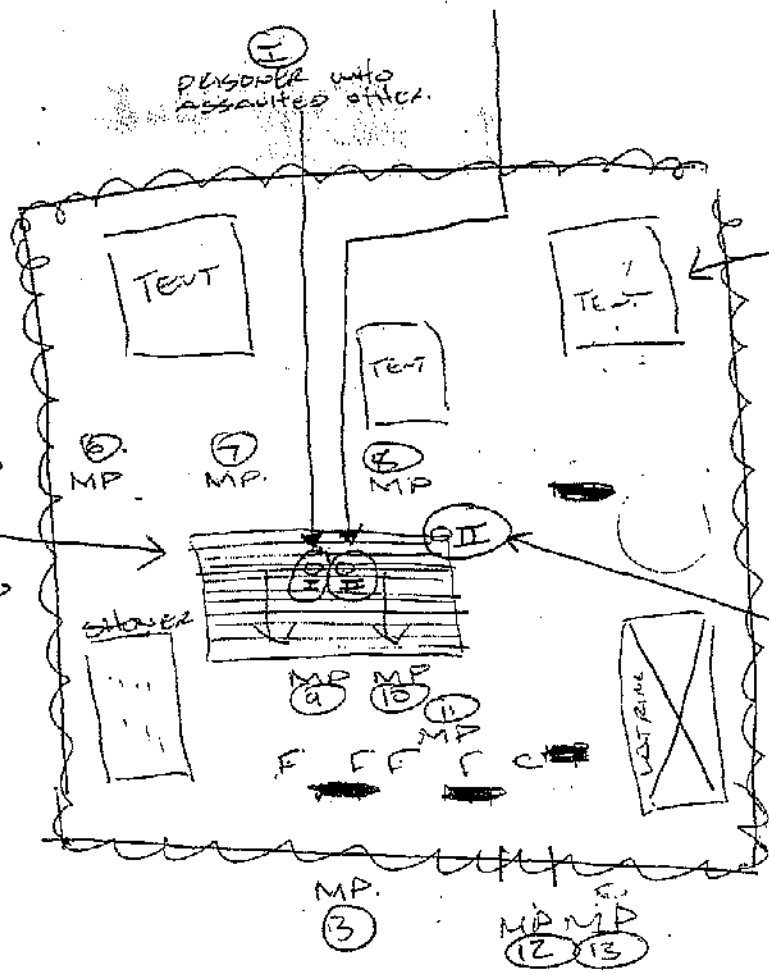

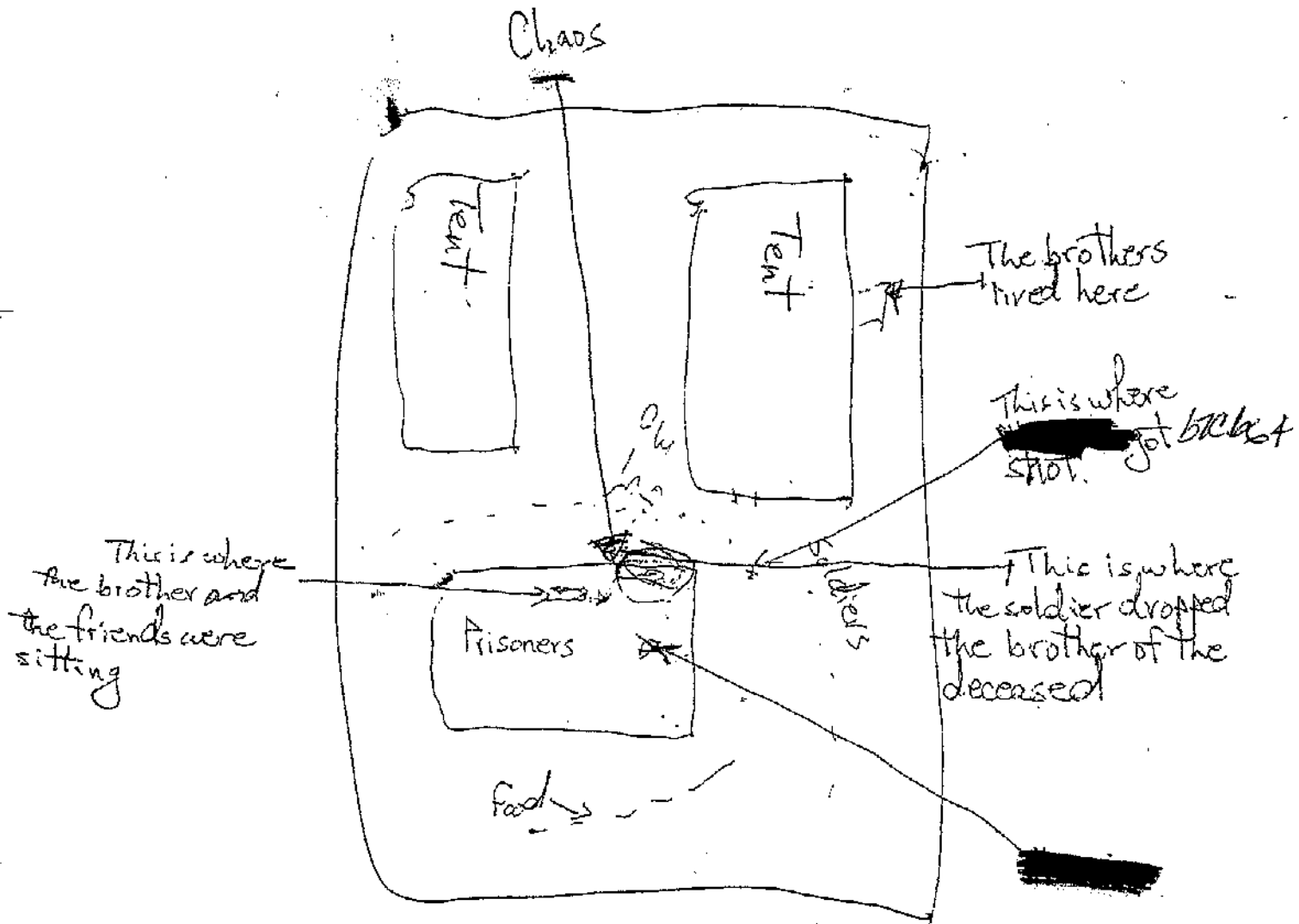
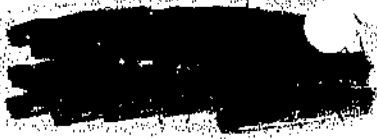

I WAS TOLD WHEN THAT HAPPENED, TO WATCH THE EPW'S ALREADY INSIDE THE TENTS TO MAKE SURE THEY DID NOT TRY TO INTERFERE WITH THE EXTRACTION, AND IF A RIOT STARTED WHILE FEED TEAM MEMBERS WERE STILL INSIDE THE COMPOUND, TO SHOOT A WARNING SHOT. At 0815Z, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] was notified of the shooting of an Enemy Prisoner of War (EPW) by a Sentry.

At 0830Z, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] was briefed by SA [redacted] of this office of the shooting incident within Compound #1, Grid Coordinate QU 77719 28738, Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq.

Agent's Comment: The Crime Scene Examination could not be conducted as it was in the EPW compound and the next feeding was scheduled at 1400Z, when the Quick Reaction Force and additional MP support could be provided. An operational decision was made to not conduct a crime scene examination until all support could be provided for security.

At 0900Z, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] interviewed MSG [redacted] 320th Military Police Battalion, Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq who was the NCOIC of the feeding team and provided a Sworn Statement, detailing her knowledge of the shooting incident and how the feeding team was attempting to stop the riot when an EPW was shot. (See sworn statement)

At 0930Z, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] collected from MSG [redacted] the weapon (four foot pipe) which was used by the EPW to attack the MP's while they were in feeding compound #1. The evidence was receipted for on DA Form 4137, Evidence/Property Custody Document, Voucher Number 042-03. (See evidence voucher)

At 0958Z, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] interviewed SSG [redacted] 314th Military Police Company, 320th MP Battalion, Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq who provided a Sworn Statement detailing how the EPW had attacked him with a four foot pipe and just missed hitting him in the head. (See sworn statement)

At 1015Z, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] advised SPC [redacted] 314th Military Police Company, Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq of his legal rights which he waived and provided a sworn statement. SPC [redacted] stated he had no choice but to shoot the EPW as he was attacking SSG [redacted] with the pipe. According to SPC [redacted] the EPW had taken a first swing when he heard an NCO (Later Identified as SFC [redacted]) 314th Military Police Company, Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq give the order to shoot the EPW. (See rights waiver certificate and sworn statement)

Agent's Comment: SPC [redacted] provided a sketch of the scene as he remembered it, which showed where he was standing when he shot the EPW. (See rough sketch)

At 1130, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] briefed CW4 [redacted] Operations Officer of this investigation and all aspects of what had occurred.

At 1300Z, 18 Apr 03, SA [redacted] briefed COL [redacted] Commander, 800th Military Police Brigade and Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq on all aspects of this investigation. COL [redacted] stated the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) was inquiring about the shooting and had requested that his medical personnel be authorized to bury the deceased before sun down in accordance with Muslim Law. SA [redacted] stated as the crime scene processing is still pending the investigation was not completed however, witness interviews appeared to sustain that the shooting was within the Rules of Engagement (ROE) and it was his decision as Camp Commander to bury the deceased. COL [redacted] stated since the ROE's were followed and it appeared to be a Justifiable Homicide he was going to bury the deceased on grounds at Camp Bucca.

Rioting and Aggravated Assault when he incited the crowd to riot then swung and missed hitting SSG [REDACTED] and the feed team with the four-foot pipe. LTC [REDACTED] opined Mr [REDACTED] was the victim of a Gun Shot Wound (GSW). however, there was no subject as Mr [REDACTED] received the GSW due to Mr YASIREE's actions and since the projectile could not be recovered it could not be ruled out that he was hit by the ricocheting round that exited Mr YASIREE. LTC [REDACTED] stated both SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] acted within the ROE and that Mr YASIREE's shooting was a Justifiable Homicide by SPC [REDACTED]. On 18 APR 03 at approx. 0920 hrs I (SSG [redacted]) SS# [redacted] took my feed team consisting of approx. 11 soldiers into Camp # 1 to feed the EPW's ^{within} that camp. As my (SSG [redacted]) feed team started to feed the EPWs, there was a verbal altercation amongst 2 EPW's to the rear of the element. One EPW dressed in dark clothing black in appearance also wearing a scarf containing red colors assaulted the other EPW with a metal like cup. The two EPWs were separated and the incident appeared to be over. Shortly there after approx 3 to 5 minutes later that same individual EPW who assaulted the EPW previously was yelling and using aggressive hand gestures at the feed time soldiers within the compound. I (SSG [redacted]) was closest to that individual and I told that EPW in Arabic to sit down & be quiet. I used the words "Ijdelas" and "Escoot" meaning sit down and be quiet. Spelling may not be correct. I then saw that same EPW continue to yell & excite the crowd that he was standing with which appeared to contain approx 300 to 400. Again the same commands were given by myself (SSG [redacted]) and they had no affect. I (SSG [redacted]) then approached SFC [redacted] NCOIC and asked him (SFC [redacted]) to get permission through the chain of command to extract the EPW who would not obey commands and who was becoming more and more aggressive towards the feed team soldiers inside the compound. SFC [redacted] then got permission and I (SSG [redacted]) then requested the QRF (Quick reaction Force) team to assist as we (feed team) were unable to conduct both operations at once for safety purposes. The EPW who would not cooperate was motioning with his hands for the EPWs who were located behind us in the far right tent to come & attack us. His motions were clearly aggressive as he was also waving a fist & making a punching like motion aimed at the feed team soldiers standing there. The two elements were now standing to the feed teams front & rear and it was unsafe to attempt to exit at that time. We (feed team) attempted to sit the EPWs in front of us down. I (SSG [redacted]) told the element to the rear to "please stop" in Arabic as they were advancing forward towards the feed team soldiers. The words used by myself (SSG [redacted]) were "Erjuk" and "Coff" which means "please" + "stop." The spelling may not be correct. Just then the EPW who would not cooperate or obey commands ran through the

Feed team soldiers and into the far right tent. The same EPW exited the tent approx. 1 minute later running with a metal like bar in his hands over his head measuring approx. 36" to 40" in length. The same individual EPW still wearing dark in color clothing with a red & white in color scarf took a swing at myself (SSG b7C/b7D) missing my head ^{by inches}. I (SSG b7C/b7D) yelled for the individual EPW to "stop" in Arabic. The word I (SSG b7C/b7D) used was "Coff" meaning "stop". The spelling may not be correct. The EPW with the pole continued to swing at me (SSG b7C/b7D) disobeying all commands. I (SSG b7C/b7D) heard one shot fired. It had no affect on the violent and aggressive crowd. The EPW continued to swing at me (SSG b7C/b7D) when there was a second shot fired. The second shot had little affect and the EPW continued to swing the pole and advance in a forward motion still disobeying all commands. A third shot was fired and this time the EPW with the pole dropped the pole and ran to the rear between the two tents where he appeared to have collapsed. At that time the element to the front and to the rear were sitting or kneeling down and I (SSG b7C/b7D) ordered my feed team to pull out in a safe & efficient manner. Upon exiting the compound the EPWs approx. 200 to 300 rushed the remainder of the food still in the compound. The entire feed team exited the compound safely and without further incident.

A: Yes, I felt that my life and the lives of my feed team members was in danger. The EPW elements to the front and to the rear became quickly violent and aggressive and intentionally ignored all verbal commands given in both English & in Arabic. It was clear to me and to my team members that their intentions were to inflict great bodily injury and possibly even death.

A: I (SSG [redacted]) yelled at the top of my lungs and in a verbally stern tone for the EPWs in both elements to stop, to sit down and to be quiet. I yelled these commands loud enough to be heard by both elements and the feed team members. As EPWs from the front element advanced towards the feed team members including myself, they were shoved and pushed back into the front element as a means of trying to control that element meanwhile providing safety to the feed team members. As the EPW elements both to the rear and to the front became more and more aggressive and continued to ignore all verbal commands, the feed team members including myself showed our batons and demonstrated their use if they continued to ignore commands and advance on the feed team members. All means of the rules of engagement were completely followed numerous times before deadly force was used.

Q: Can you describe the EPW who attacked you?

A: The EPW who attacked me was wearing dark in color clothing appearing to be black in color. He was wearing a red + white in scarf. The same EPW appeared to be about 74" tall weighing approx 160 to 170 lbs. To my best recollecting he had a mustache and his hair color was black in color. His eyes were brown in color and he was wearing shoes although I'm not sure of the type or color. The EPW also had a metal like pole gripped with both hands positioned over his head as he swung and ran at me in an attempt to inflict great bodily harm. Since I did not have a pistol or a rifle on me, all I could do was follow the rules of engagement and protect both myself and my team members by evasion.

Q: Is there anything else you would like to add to this statement, or do you have any information that I have not asked you that you would like to add?

... WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH: I was posted as a sentry outside pen #1. At approximately 09:30 the feed team entered pen #1. The feed team then attempted to put all the EPWs into their standard formation for feeding. A few dozen individuals went through the feed line when a large group stood up and started moving. Orders were given by the feed team for the EPWs to sit down and move into the tent (FOR THOSE WHO HAD ALREADY RECEIVED FOOD). The EPWs were responding to a disturbance between an EPW and a feed team member. After 2 minutes the group of EPWs began to settle down, and gather back into formation. I was then told that a prisoner would be extracted once he had made his way through the food line. About 5 minutes later when about 100 EPWs were left to be feed, another commotion started between the EPWs and the feed team. About 40-50 EPWs began coming out of the tents, surrounding several members of the feed team. Orders were shouted out for the EPWs to "Get Back", "Move Back", "Get Back to your Tents". Less than a dozen complied with these verbal orders. At least two physical confrontations erupted between EPWs and feed team members who were trying to maintain some order and move the EPWs back into the tent.

About 30 more seconds elapsed and most of the feed team members were surrounded by EPWs. A feed team member then shouted "Take a shot" or "Take a warning shot". SPC [REDACTED] then fired a warning shot into the ground. Most of the EPW's continued to surround the feed team. [REDACTED] saw an EPW run back into the tent and come back out with a large metal tent stake, the EPW began to swing the stake at a feed team members head, missing when the feed team member moved. The EPW then retracted back and rushed at a feed team member, I fired two shots at the EPW with the metal tent stake. The first shot missed the EPW with the weapon. The EPW raised the stake again to strike a feed team member and I shot him. He then ran back into the tent, I stood along the fence line until other EPW's started throwing rocks at me.

Q: Do you Follow the Rules of Engagements to the Letter?

A: Yes, when the disturbance began, verbal orders were given in an attempt to quell the disturbance. Feed team members attempted to physically move EPW's and control the situation. This did not work. Next when the feed team members could not control the situation, I showed my weapon and stood ready to use it. Next when a fellow MP was in danger of being struck with a large metal stake I shot the offending EPW.

Q: Can you Describe The EPW you Shot AND what he was Doing when you Shot him

A: The EPW had a large metal pipe in his hand raised. He was wearing a red/white scarf covering his entire face, except for his eyes. He was of thin build, approximately 68" tall. [REDACTED]

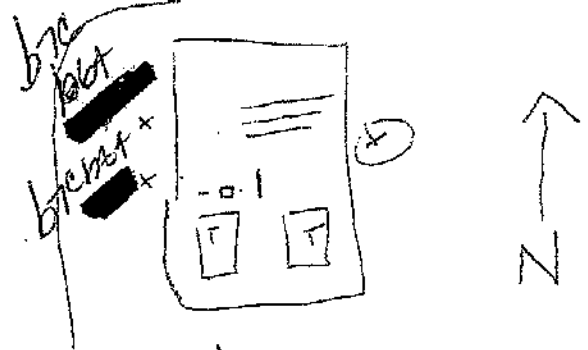
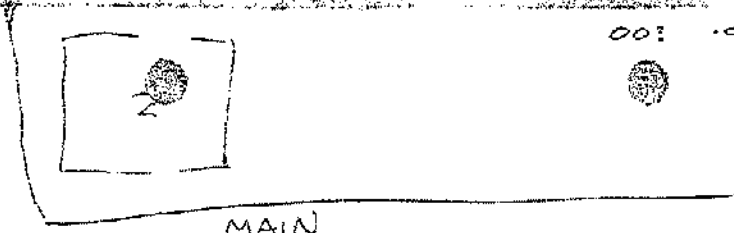

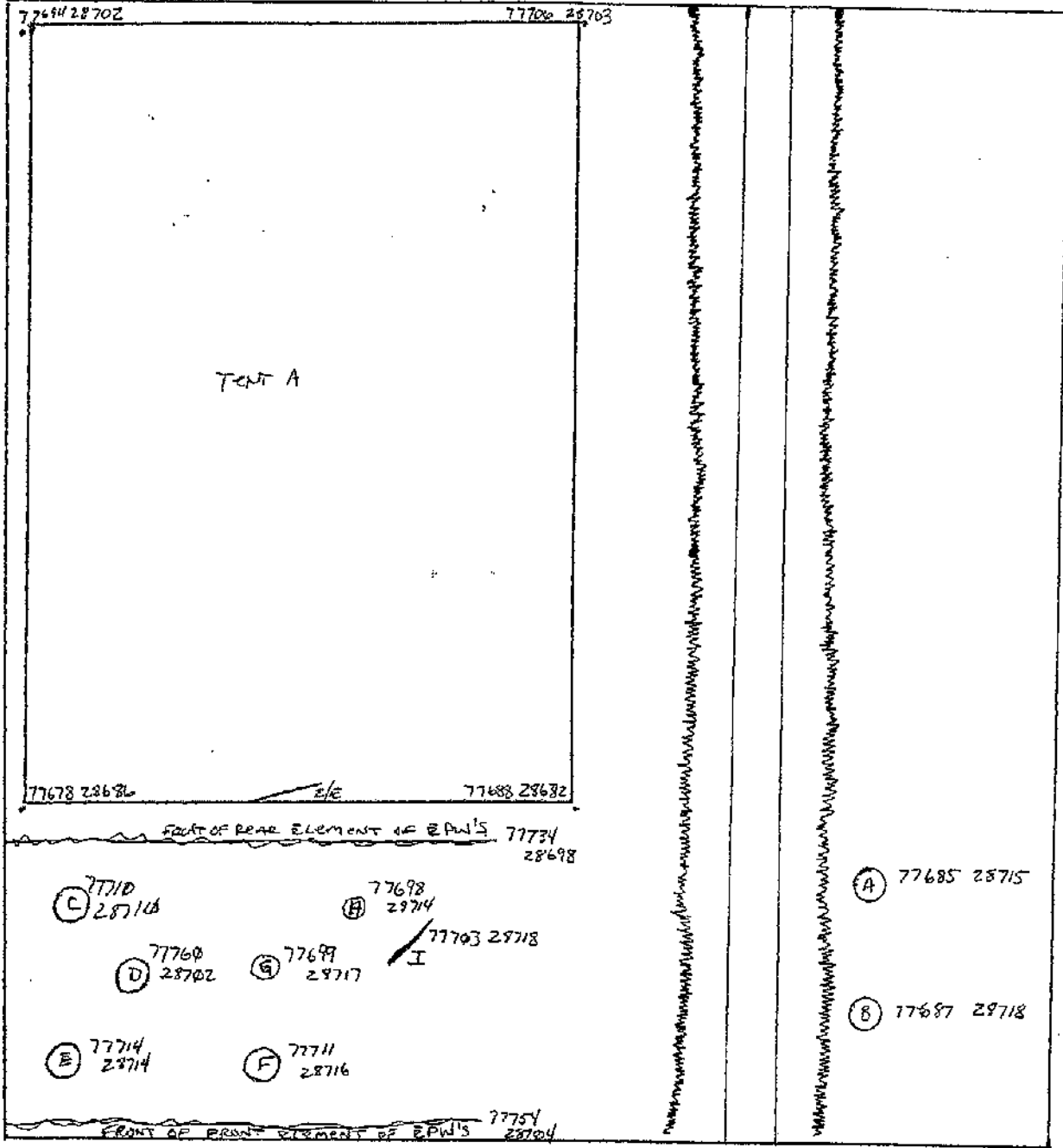

THIS IS AN "OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM" INVESTIGATION. THE DELAY IN DISPATCHING THIS REPORT WAS DUE TO THE LACK OF SECURE COMMUNICATIONS CAPABILITIES FOR CID AT THE EPW CAMP.

THIS INVESTIGATION WAS INITIATED WHEN MAJ [REDACTED] b7c b7d, DEPUTY STAFF JUDGE ADVOCATE, 800TH MILITARY POLICE BRIGADE, CAMP BUCCA, UM QASR, IRAQ NOTIFIED THIS OFFICE OF THE SHOOTING OF AN ENEMY PRISONER OF WAR (EPW) BY A SENTRY.

PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION REVEALED MR YASIREE INCITED A RIOT BY ATTACKING THE MILITARY POLICE FEEDING TEAM AND INCITING THE CROWD TO DO THE SAME AND WAS SHOT BY A SENTRY WHEN HE SWUNG A LARGE METAL POLE AT THE MILITARY POLICE.

THROUGH THE CONDUCT OF WITNESS AND CANVASS INTERVIEWS IT WAS DETERMINED MR YASIREE OBTAINED A FOUR-FOOT TENT STAKE AND THEN ATTACKED SSG [REDACTED] WHILE HE WAS CONDUCTING HIS DUTIES AS A FEED TEAM MEMBER. AT THE SAME TIME OF THE ATTACK BY MR YASIREE, SPC [REDACTED] AND SPC [REDACTED] b7c b7d

[REDACTED] BOTH SENTRIES ON THE OUTSIDE PERIMETER OF COMPOUND #1 ASSIGNED TO 314TH MILITARY POLICE COMPANY, EPW CAMP BUCCA, UM QASR, IRAQ HEARD AN UNKNOWN NCO (NFI) SHOUT TO SHOOT A WARNING SHOT WHICH SPC [REDACTED] DID. SPC [REDACTED] SHOT A WARNING SHOT INTO THE DEEP SAND AT HIS FEET WITH HIS BERETTA M9, 9MM PISTOL, SN 1271038, WHICH DID NOT DETER THE ENCROACHING CROWD OF EPWS FROM MOVING INTO THE MP'S PERIMETER. SPC NG OBSERVED MR YASIREE SWINGING WHAT APPEARED TO BE A STEEL OBJECT/POLE. SSG [REDACTED] AND THE FEED TEAM MEMBERS DISPERSED THE CROWD WHEN THE AFRAY STARTED, AND MR YASIREE WENT INTO THE SLEEPING TENT AND CAME OUT SHORTLY AFTER WITH A LARGE TENT STAKE/POLE. CPT (DR) [REDACTED] ^{b7c/b7d} BATTALION SURGEON, 320TH MP BN, CAMP BUCCA INITIATED ADVANCED LIFE SAVING PROTOCOLS WHICH WERE UNSUCCESSFUL. 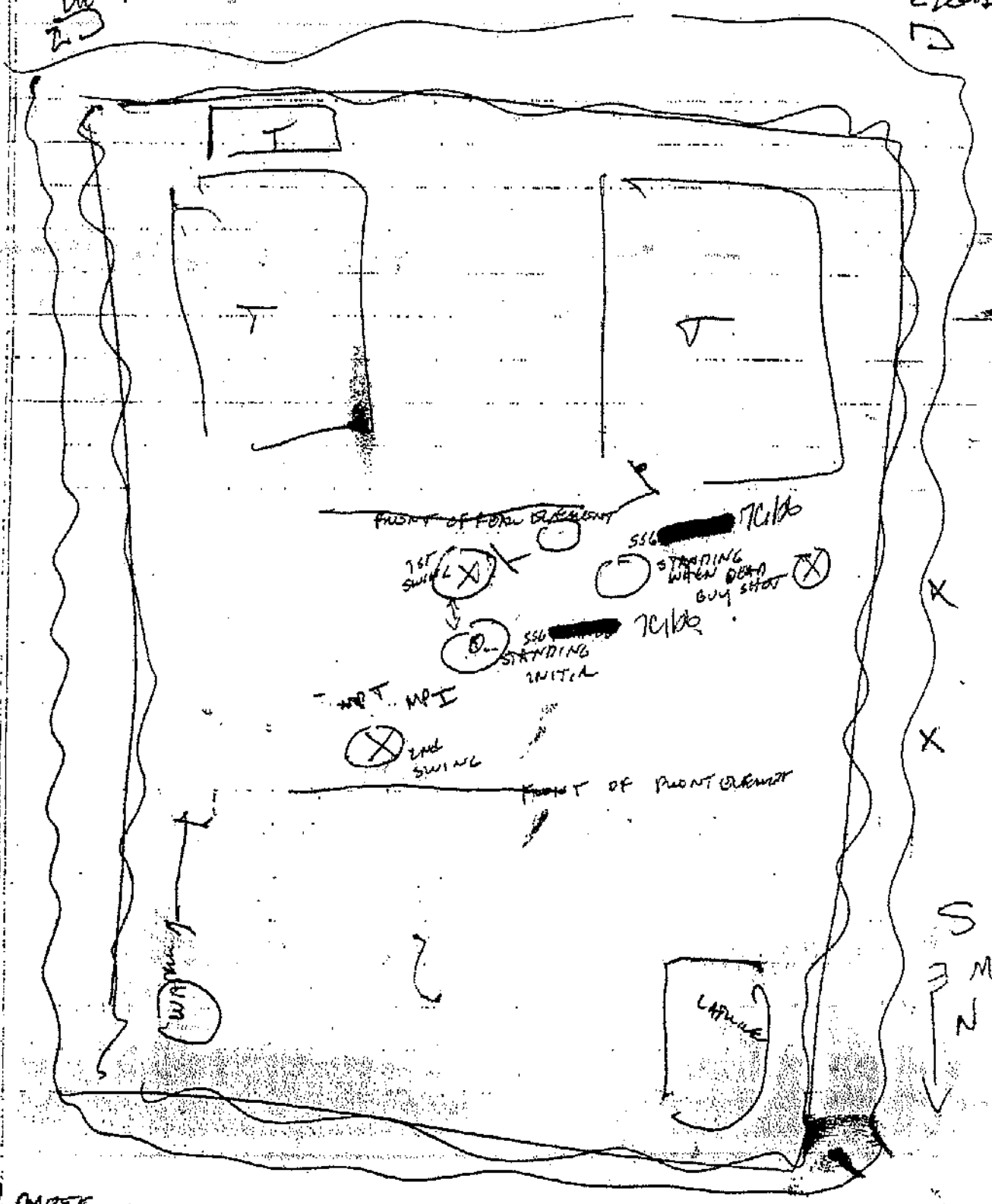

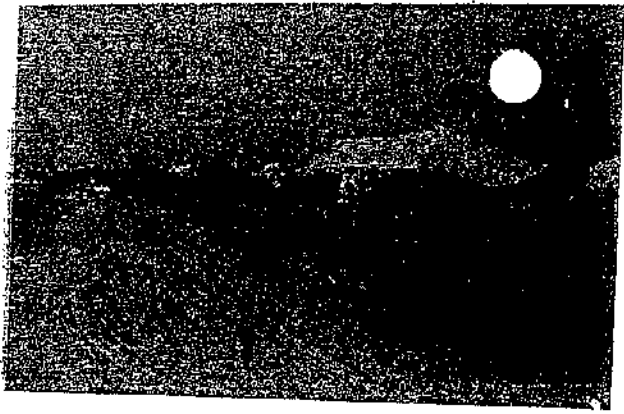

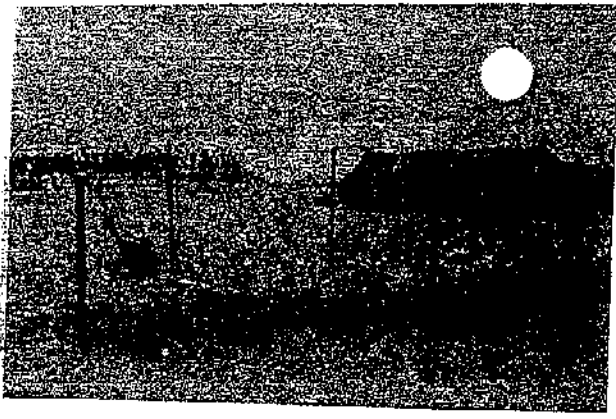
