

This is an Operation Iraqi Freedom investigation.

On 08 March 2004 this investigation was initiated based on notification from the 22nd MP Battalion (CID), Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq, APO AE 09342, that a detainee from the Detention Facility, Camp Cropper, BIAP, IZ, APO AE 09342 had died.

Investigation established probable cause to believe that Mr. ABBAS died of Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease while being detained at the Detention Facility, Camp Cropper, BIAP, IZ, APO AE 09342.



Sather, IZ. COL Stated Mr ABBAS was transported to the EMED unit on Camp Sather, where he was later pronounced dead by COL COL Stated Mr ABBAS was not responsive to advanced life saving measures. COL Stated he did not observe any signs of trauma to the body of Mr ABBAS.

COL Stated Mr ABBAS was pronounced dead at 0032, 8 Feb 04.

AGENT'S COMMENT: A subsequent preliminary examination of the remains of Mr ABBAS, conducted by the aforementioned agents, disclosed no apparent any injuries or trauma.

696-1,66-1 676-3, 66-3 1135, 8 Mar 04, SA coordinated with COL (DR) 112th MP Bn, Camp Cropper, BIAP, Baghdad, IZ. COL was identified as treating and subsequently performing lifesaving measures on Mr ABBAS. COL stated he was asleep about 2330, 7 Mar 04, in his quarters, when SGT dwakened him and told him that one of the detainees was complaining of chest pain. COL said he and SGT went to the detainee's quarters and found Mr ABBAS lying on his cot rubbing his chest and complaining of a burning pain in his chest. During guestioning by SGT COL heard Mr ABBAS say that he had been experiencing the chest pain for over one-hour before asking for medical assistance. COL related that he observed SGT question Mr ABBAS concerning his condition and then SGT suggested that they move Mr ABBAS to the detainees' medical facility to better diagnose his condition. stated SGT offered to get a stretcher and carry Mr. ABBAS to the detainees' medical facility, but he refused the offer and said he wanted to walk. With SGT descriptions assistance, they escorted Mr ABBAS to the detainees' medical facility. SGT attached a heart monitor to Mr ABBAS' chest. Upon viewing Mr ABBAS heart said he recognized that Mr ABBAS had recently experienced a heart attack. While he was discussing his observations with SGT Mr ABBAS went into cardiac arrest. COL stated that he and SGT attempted to resuscitate Mr ABBAS by administering epinephrine, lidocaine and utilized the defibrillation machine several times; however, they were unable to revive Mr ABBAS. During this time, several other soldiers administered CPR and rescue breathing. With the arrival of the ambulance from the 477th EMED, COL said that he transferred care of





WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH: I am an Arabic translator employed by Titan Corporation, Baghdad, Iraq and have been for about a year. I work on Camp Cropper, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq. I provide translator support to the Military Police for the detainees there. About 1125 PM and I was in my room reading a book. Then because 4 someone knocked on my door. I said to come in and it was SPC informed me that there was an emergency and he needed my help. I then put on my shoes and we ran out towards the detention compound. When we got to the gate the guards open the doors for us and we went straight to our medical clinic. We then went inside of the clinic and SGT told me that one of the detainees was complaining of having chest pains. So went to the detainee's room to find out what was going on. When we went inside of the room, there were several detainees there. I went and stood right next to the detainee, and I asked him where does it hurt. And he told me in Arabic, that his chest was kind of tight and he had difficulty breathing in Arabic. He was laying down on his cot and he had a towel on his head. I then turned to the COL and told him that he was complaining about his chest hurting and he was having difficulty breathing. told the detainee in Arabic to sit up and get out of the cot so that he could be taken to the clinic. When we got inside of the clinic, I told him to sit on the gurney so that the COL can treat him. I told the detainee to lift up his shirt so that some pads can be put on his chest so that his heart can be monitored. The detainee took his shirt off and started to look pale and extremely tired. Then SGT put the pads on his chest to start to monitor his heart. I then left and went to the 439th MP Bn trailer and I ran into SPC a phone call because we have a detainee that is complaining of chest pains and he did not look good. I went back to the clinic, and I told the COL and SGT that emergency help was on the way. At that time the COL was giving mouth to mouth resuscitation to the detainee. I then ran back to the 439th MP Bn trailer, and told SPC to hurry up because we were losing the man. I then went back to the clinic, and SGT had an IV hooked up to the patient. He asked me to hold the IV bag up while SGT gave the detainee a shot and the COL continued to give mouth to mouth to the detainee. The COL then left to get the defibrillator. When he came back, the COL hooked up the machine and gave him a shock. After waiting a minute and watching the monitor, the detainee was unresponsive. So the COL gave him another shock and there was no response from the detainee. They continued to perform CPR on the detainee. Sometime thereafter, the ambulance showed up and we carried the detainee out of the clinic





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
